Nebucadnezzar was restored to his throne in the Jubilee year after "seven times" had passed over him. This is the sabbatic period starting in 570 b.c. A Jubilee is seven sevens plus one. Jehoiachin was let out of prison the following year after the death of the old king.

This Jubilee synchronism is similar to Joseph's. The nations will begin to serve the Most High in the Jubilee year when Yeshua returns just as Nebucadnezzar.

This sabbatic period of madness lasted 2569 days from 9/11/570 B.C. to 9/23/563 B.C., and corresponds to the exact number of years that Babylon "is not" in power (539/538 B.C. to 2030/2031 A.D.)

KJV Daniel 4:34 And at the **end of the days** I Nebucadnezzar lifted up mine eyes unto heaven, and mine understanding returned unto me, and I blessed the most High, and I praised and honoured him that liveth for ever, whose dominion is an everlasting dominion, and his kingdom is from generation to generation:

9/22/563 B.C. JP, JD = 1,516,052.16. New Moon sighted.

Evil Merodach

KJV 2 Kings 25:27 And it came to pass in the **seven and thirtieth year** of the captivity of Jehoiachin king of Judah, **in the twelfth month, on the seven and twentieth day of the month**, that Evilmerodach king of Babylon **in the year that he began to reign** did lift up the head of Jehoiachin king of Judah out of prison; (Jer. 52:31). **Sabbath**, 4/2/561 JP-BAB, night).

Neriglissar

The Biblical chronology confirms the correctness of the Saros Tablets dating of the Babylonian and Persian kings, by giving the Saros cycles of 233 lunar months, which is 18 years, and the regnal year of the kings when the cycles repeated.

9th (year of) Darius [I]	18 (years)
27th (year of) Darius [I]	18 (years)
9th (year of) Xerxes	18 (years)
6th (year of) Artaxerxes [I]	18 (years)
24th (year of) Artaxerxes [I]	18 (years)
1st (year of) Darius [II]	18 (years)

The lengths of the reign of the various kings can be confirmed by computing the intervals of 18 years. (*The Chronology of Ezra 7*, S.H. Horn, L.H. Wood, pg. 95).

KJV Daniel 7:1 In the first year of Belshazzar king of Babylon Daniel had a dream and visions of his head upon his bed: then he wrote the dream, and told the sum of the matters.

Archaeological cuneform records show that Belshazzar was coregent, but the regnal year synchronism is not directly stated. Given here is the scholarly consensus on their reconstruction.
