KJV Ezra 4:6 And in the reign of Ahasuerus, **in the beginning of his reign**, wrote they unto him an accusation against the inhabitants of Judah and Jerusalem.

Xerxes

KJV Esther 1:3 In the **third year** of his reign, he made a feast unto all his princes and his servants; the power of Persia and Media, the nobles and princes of the provinces, being before him:

KJV Esther 2:16 So Esther was taken unto king Ahasuerus into his house royal in the **tenth month**, which is the month Tebeth, in the **seventh year** of his reign. (Sunday 12/22/479 B.C. JP to Monday 1/20/478 B.C. JP, BIB & BAB).

KJV Nehemiah 12:10 And **Jeshua** begat Joiakim, Joiakim also begat Eliashib, and Eliashib begat Joiada, 11 And Joiada begat Jonathan, and Jonathan begat Jaddua.

NRS Esther 3:7 In the **first month**, which is the month of Nisan, **in the twelfth year** of King Ahasuerus, they cast Pur-- which means "the lot"-- before Haman for the day and for the month, and the lot fell on the **thirteenth day of the twelfth month, which is the month of Adar**. (Thur, March 6, 473 B.C. JP, BIB & BAB, 13th day supplied by NRS from 3:13).

There are also some tablets dated to the 21st and last year of Xerxes. One of them, BM 32234, which is dated to day 14 or 18 of the 5th month of Xerxes' 21st year, belongs to the group of astronomical texts called "18-year texts" or "Saros texts". The astronomical information preserved on this tablet fixes it to the year 465 BC. The text includes the following interesting information: "Month V 14 (+x) Xerxes was murdered by his son." This text alone not only shows that Xerxes ruled for 21 years, but also that his last year was 465 BC.

Cyrus Artaxerxes I (Longimanus)

Finegan (§236) says "Later the point from which to start the [Jubilee] count was taken to be the first year of Artaxerxes." Finegan thinks this is by Zuckermann's cycle, but the starting point is the correct synchronization for the Jubilee, using the correct year for the 7th year. It is possible that there was confusion over the meaning of the "first year" which can mean the "accession year" (§421)
