The realization that the professed Christian faith of many is fraudulent and really faith in human tradition can make one very ill of heart. I really do not know how many lies the Father can or will tolerate placed next to the golden truth of Messiah Yeshua. I think His tolerance is higher when it is just a question of ignorance, and lower when it is not. I leave it up to the Holy Spirit to show you personally what you should change and at what rate you should change it. That is how we continue to walk in the ways of the Almighty. But such change as needs to happen, cannot happen without knowledge. One must first discover the truth before making any changes. This book aims to reveal that truth.

Therefore, we must ask some hard questions. The questions are hard because their answers may not be addressed with objectivity, but with an emotionally programmed reaction. The reader must overcome this, and I pray they do so with the help of the Ruakh (Spirit), so that you can discover the truth in order to follow Yeshua as a good and faithful servant that puts a smile on His face.

Why do Christians hold their main worship services on Sunday? It is because they want to memorialize the resurrection of Yeshua on Sunday. Remembering His resurrection is commendable and all important, but the way we remember things best, is to have the correct facts about what we want to remember. We are not correctly remembering if we get the story half wrong. As we shall see, Messiah's resurrection has nothing to do with Sunday. We also want to remember his death, and what it means. This is good. But to remember it rightly means we must learn that it has nothing to do with Friday.

The Scripture says nothing about observing Sunday. It says to observe the Sabbath. The basic issue is that most saying they are Christians do not want to keep the Instruction of the Almighty. They want to keep their own tradition even if it requires a made up excuse. When faced with the fact that heaven and earth have not passed away, and therefore, all things cannot be fulfilled, so the Torah must remain valid, many do not want to discuss it anymore. Yet, in their resolution to turn off the discussion they have left quite a flaw in their thinking.

Ignoring the question does not do away with the future fulfillment of YHWH's Law.

We who observe the Sabbath sign between us and the Almighty of Israel, must also know the truth and check our assumptions. When did Yeshua rise from the dead? Is the common Christian reasoning also a lie? This book will demonstrate that Messiah rose on the seventh day Sabbath near dawn, and not on Sunday morning as Christians commonly claim. It will show that Messiah was three days and three nights in the grave, and not two nights, as Christians commonly believe.

Christians will consider this an extraordinary claim requiring extraordinary proof. Extraordinary proof will be provided in this book because most are extraordinarily deceived. The proof will involve many details and amazing facts that most have never heard of, which are true, and can be verified. To uncover the truth we must first uncover layers and layers of deception. If the reader endures to the end, then he or she will come away not only convinced, but truly amazed at the degree to which most Christians have been deceived.

So, if the resurrection of Messiah was on the Sabbath, then why do the traditions not remember it? Why does everyone think it was on Sunday? If every Christian believes the resurrection was on Sunday, then it must be so? If all the Christian writers of history believed the same, then that makes it true? Is it so possible for the mass of Christians to forget the original day?

Yāhweh has caused to be forgotten the appointed feast and Sabbath in Zion. (Lam 2:6).

And I will destroy her vines and fig trees, of which she said, 'These are my wages which my lovers have given me.' And I will make them a forest, and the beasts of the field will devour them.
