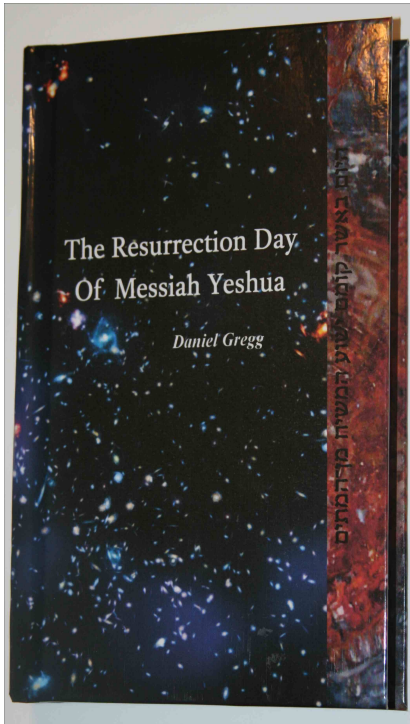

**The Resurrection Day
Of Messiah Yeshua**

When It Happened

According To The Original
Texts

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(laid out in book order)

The starting date was proved earlier, so the following will explain how the counting is codified:

You shall also count for yourselves in the time to come after the ceasing, from the day when you brought in the sheaf of the wave offering; there shall be seven complete Sabbaths. (Lev 23:15).

From this text is derived the precept to count Sabbaths in addition to seven seven-day periods (Deut. 16:9). Hence the clause counting the Sabbaths is inserted into the blessing. These are “weekly” Sabbaths or “seventh day” Sabbaths. This is the significance of the word “complete.” For in English we say weekly Sabbath or seventh day Sabbath to indicate a regular Sabbath as opposed to a festival Sabbath. The Hebrew uses the word meaning “perfect” or “complete” as this is the other sense of the word “seven.”

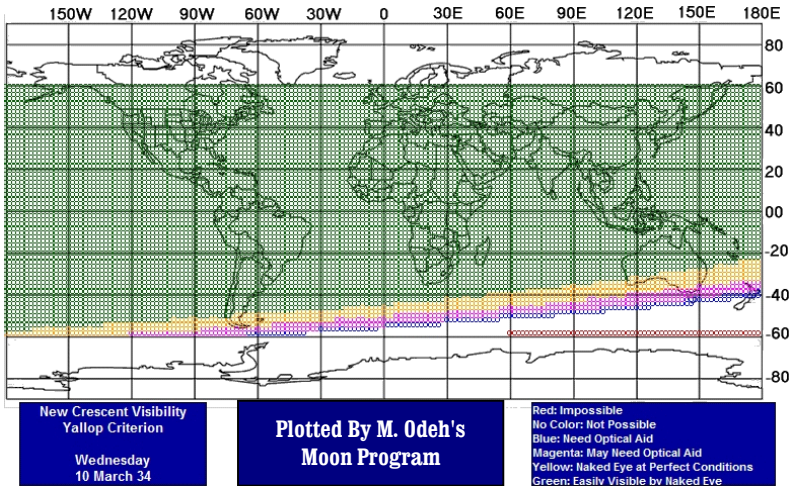
The recitation is done shortly after sunrise, but any time between that and sunset fulfills the Torah—as the counting was to begin as soon as the sheaf was waved in the morning. Rabbinic Jews recite the blessing after previous sunset, but this is based on a post exilic reckoning of the day, and is not exactly correct according to Deut. 16:9. One should notice the repetition of *IN THE DAY AFTER*. This is specifically designed to teach the Hebrew sense of this phrase—which Israel having forgotten is one of the major causes of confusion on how to count. Similar usage is found in Gen. 2:4 and Gen 30:33.

Yet in the time to come after the seventh Sabbath you are counting a fiftieth day; then you shall present a new grain offering to Yāhweh. (Lev 23:16).

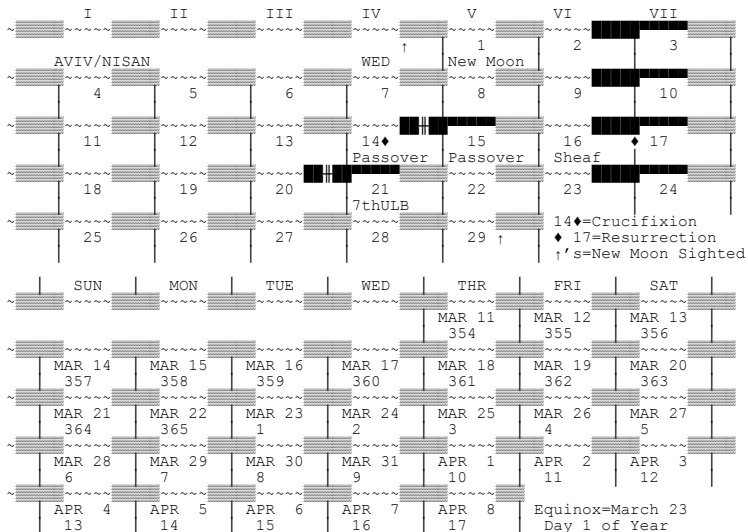
From this text is derived the precept to count all the days in sequence, from one to fifty. So this too is included in the blessing for each day.
