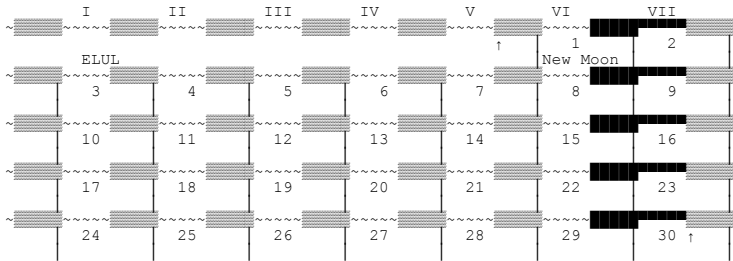

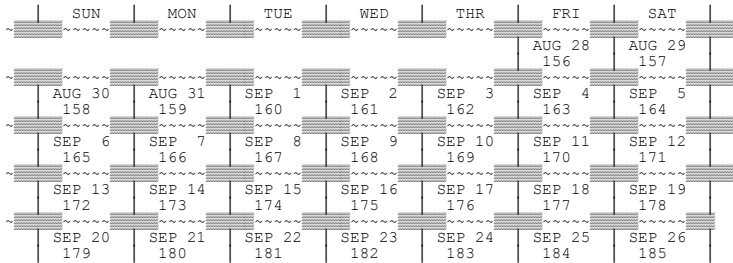

There is one final proof that Nehemiah did not build the walls in 444 B.C. Neh. 6:15 tells us that the wall were finished in 52 days on the 25th of the month of Elul. Please notice that the 25th of Elul was on the 2nd day of the week. This makes the beginning day of the 52 days Av 3 (Aug 1), which was a Sabbath.

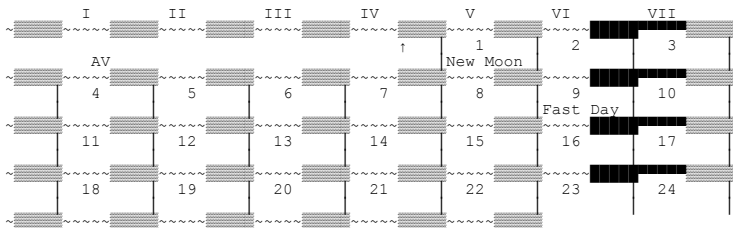


Here is the Julian equivalent of Elul, 444 B.C.:

Notice that Av 3 (Aug 1) is the 129th day of the year, and that Elul 25 (Sept 1) is the 180th day of the year. The formula of inclusive counting is to subtract and add 1. Thus  $180-129+1 = 52$ . A.D. 33 advocates should be made aware of the fact that their theory requires the famed wall builder and Sabbath reformer to start his project on the Sabbath.

The second point of calculation A.D. 33 advocates introduce is the 360 day year. They first reduce the actual  $365\frac{1}{4}$  day year length to 360 days claiming that they may do so because a “prophetic year” is 360 days. This is supposed to be justified because the year during Noah’s flood is assumed to be 360 days.<sup>329</sup> Clearly the year was not 360 days in the period between Nehemiah and Messiah. Further, they argue that the book of Revelation employs a 360 day year by assuming that 42 months equals 1260 days, and then they divide this to find one month equal to 30 days and then multiply by 12 to arrive at 360. However, Revelation nowhere equates 42 months and 1260 days. 42 months on the scriptural calendar is  $29.5 \times 42 = 1239$  days, give or take a day. So the period of anti-Messiah’s rule is shorter than the period of time Israel is protected. Nowhere is exact equation of the time periods stated.

Nevertheless, advocates of A.D. 33 must use a 360 day year, because it is the only way their calculation even comes close. This
