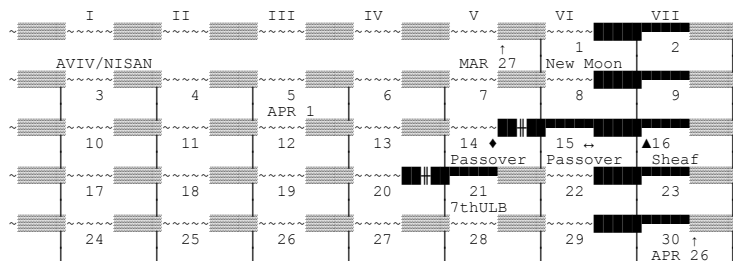

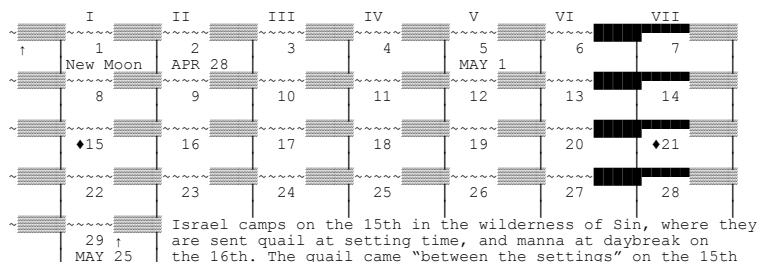

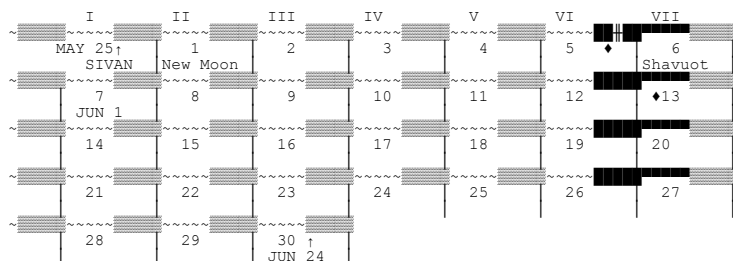
The Passover was killed at the ♦ on the 14th of Aviv. The Exodus began at daybreak on the 15th of Aviv and lasted till daybreak on the 16th of Aviv, when they were allowed to eat and rest on the Sabbath, marked by ▲.

The first diamond ♦ marks when YHWH spoke the Torah to Israel. Then on the day part of the Sabbath the 70 elders of Israel ascended the mountain and they saw YHWH (Exodus 24). After Shavuot, on Sivan 6 (the Sabbath), the cloud covered Mt. Sinai 6 days (Sivan 7 to Sivan 12) and then YHWH spoke to Moses on the 7th day (Sivan 13).
